

# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

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To the Members of Saiguru Buildmart Private Limited

## 1) Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Saiguru Buildmart Private Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2014, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

## 2) Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements.

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the Accounting Standards referred to in sub-section (3C) of section 211 of the Companies Act, 1956 ("the Act") read with the General Circular 15/2013 dated 13 September 2013 of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs in respect of section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013. This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

## 3) Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Company's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

## 4) Unqualified Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- (a) In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2014;
- (b) In the case of the Statement of Profit and Loss, of the loss incurred by the Company for the year ended on that date; and
- (c) In the case of the Cash Flow Statement, of the cash flows of the Company for the year ended on that date.



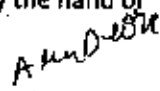
## 5) Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

  - v) On the basis of written representations received from the directors as on March 31, 2014, and taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on March 31, 2014, from being appointed as a director in terms of clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 274 of the Companies Act, 1956.

- I. The Company does not own any fixed asset. Accordingly, provisions of clauses (i) (a), (i) (b) and (i) (c) of paragraph 4 of the Order are not applicable to the Company.
- II.
  - (a) The inventories were physically verified by the management at reasonable intervals during the year.
  - (b) In our opinion, the procedures of physical verification of inventory followed by the management are reasonable and adequate in relation to the size of the Company and the nature of its business.
  - (c) The Company is maintaining proper records of inventory. There are no discrepancies noticed on physical verification of inventory as compared to book records.
- III. The Company has not granted any loans, secured or unsecured, to companies, firms or other parties covered in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. Accordingly, provisions of clause 4(iii)(a) to 4(iii)(d) of the Order are not applicable to the Company.
  - (e) The Company has taken short term unsecured loan from its holding company, listed in the register maintained under section 301 of the Companies Act, 1956. The maximum amount involved during the year was Rs. 4,76,50,000 and the year ended balance of the said loan was Rs. 4,73,50,000.
  - (f) In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the above loan is interest free, and other terms and conditions of such loans, as per mutually agreed stipulations, are not prima facie prejudicial to the interests of the Company.
  - (g) In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, the above said loan is repayable on demand and no payment of principal and interest is due as at the year end.
- IV. In our opinion and according to the information and explanations given to us, there are adequate internal control procedures commensurate with the size of the Company and the nature of its business. During the course of our audit, we have neither come across nor have been informed of any continuing failure to correct major weaknesses in internal control systems.

  - (a) Based on the audit procedures applied by us, and according to the information and explanations provided by the management, we are of the opinion that the transactions that need to be entered into the register maintained under section 301, have been so entered.
  - (b) Transactions made in pursuance of such contracts or arrangements have been made at prices which are reasonable, having regard to the prevailing market prices at the relevant time.



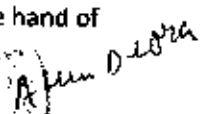
- VI. The Company has not accepted any deposits from the public.

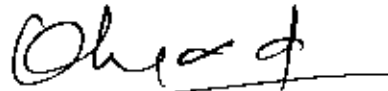

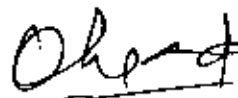

**1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**a) BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles ("Indian GAAP"). The Company has prepared these financial statements to comply in all material aspects with the accounting standard notified under the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules, 2006 as amended and the relevant provision of the Companies Act, 1956. The financial statement have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on accrual basis.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation and presentation of financial statements are consistent with those of previous year. The management evaluates all recently issued or revised accounting standards on a ongoing basis.

**b) RECOGNITION OF REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE**

Income and expenditure are accounted for on accrual basis.

**c) INVENTORIES**

Inventories comprise properties which are valued at lower of cost or net market value on First In First Out (FIFO) basis. Cost includes cost of acquisition and other related expenses incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. Net market value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business.

**d) CASH FLOW STATEMENT**

Cash flows are reported using indirect method, whereby net profit before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from regular revenue generating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated.

**e) EARNINGS PER SHARE**

The Company reports basic and diluted earnings per share (EPS) in accordance with Accounting Standard 20 on Earnings Per Share. Basic EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year as adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares, except where the results are anti-dilutive.

**f) UNAMORTISED EXPENDITURE**

Unamortised expenditure comprises preliminary expenditure incurred by the Company which is equally written off in 10 instalments.

**g) CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS**

In the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents includes cash in hand, demand deposits with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturity of three months or less.
