- 1. 1. Significant accounting policies

a) Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and comply in all material respects with the accounting standards prescribed by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IGAAP requires the use of management estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates are based on historical experience and information that is available to management about current events and actions that the Company may take in the future. Significant items subject to estimates and assumptions include the useful lives of property and equipment, evaluation of impairment of property and equipment, identifiable intangible assets and goodwill, provision for income tax and deferred tax, contingencies and the allowance for doubtful accounts receivable and advances. Due to the inherent uncertainty involved in making estimates, and if the future projection fails to materialize, the actual results including analysis of probable impairment could differ from these estimates.

b) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of an asset comprises the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.

c) Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on fixed assets on Straight Line Method over their estimated useful lives. The depreciation rates used are as follows:

(i)	Computers	3 years
(ii)	Furniture and Fittings	5 years
(iii)	Office equipment	5 years
(iv)	Mobile phones (included under office equipment)	100% in the year of purchase

Cost of Software packages are amortized over a period of three years.

Notes on Accounts (Contd) d) Operating Lease

Where the company is a lessee:

Leases where the lessor effectively retains substantially all the risks and benefits of ownership of the leased term are classified as operating leases. Operating lease payments are recognized as an expense in the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Where the company is a lessor:

Lease income by sub-lease of office premises is recognized in the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term. Costs incurred towards such properties are recognized as expenses in the profit and loss account.

e) Revenue recognition

Revenue from title and related operations are primarily transactions based and are recognized as revenue when services are performed, the fee is fixed or determinable, and collection is reasonably assured.

Unbilled revenue represents work executed in accordance with the terms of the agreement with customers but not billed as of the balance sheet date.

f) Convenience Translation

The books of accounts of the company are maintained in US Dollars being the currency of the primary economic environment in which it operates and the reporting currency is Indian Rupees (INR). The company does not have any transactions entered in any other currency apart from US Dollars. Solely for the convenience of the reader, the balance sheet as of December 31, 2010 and the Profit and Loss account for the year ended have been translated into INR, the reporting currency, using the year end exchange rate as of December 31, 2010 which was 1US\$ = Rs 44.71. The convenience translation should not be construed as a representation that the US\$ amounts or the INR amounts referred to in these financial statements have been, could have been, or could in the future be, converted into INR or US\$, as the case may be, at this or at any other rate of exchange, or at all.

g) Tax expenses

Provision for current tax, where applicable, is made based on the liability computed in accordance with the relevant tax rates and the tax laws applicable. Provision for deferred tax is made for all timing differences arising between the taxable income and accounting income at the tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance sheet date.

Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized. In situations where the Group has unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward tax losses, all deferred tax assets are recognized only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that they can be realized against future taxable profits and are reviewed for the appropriateness of their carrying values at each balance sheet date.

h) Investments

Long-term investments are carried at cost. However, provision for diminution in the value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investments. Share of profit/loss from investee companies also accounted in the respective period

i) Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

Provisions are recognised only when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and when a reliable estimate of the amount of obligation can be made. Contingent liability is disclosed for (i) possible obligation which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the Company or (ii) present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made. Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realised.

2. Taxation

- (i) Current taxes represent the US State taxes paid during the year.
- (ii) Deferred tax assets are calculated with reference to the business loss and unabsorbed depreciation as per tax and other timing differences. However, in view of uncertainty with regard to the availability of profits in near future and as a matter of prudence, deferred tax asset has not been recognized.

3. Cash and Bank Balance

Cash and bank balances include escrow balances that are managed by Richmond. Richmond has the legal rights to use these funds as appropriate to administer claims on behalf of the client. The amount of funds under management at December 2010 was US\$ 17,107,198 (Previous year 31st December 2009 - \$2,033,301).

4. Leases

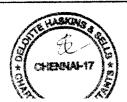
a) Operating Lease

The net worth of the entity as at 31st December 2010 has been substantially eroded and the entity is dependent upon the parent entities for liquidity support on a continuing basis. The entity and all the companies in the group (CFCL Technologies Limited and its subsidiaries) plan to manage liquidity during the year 2011 through capital infusion already made by existing shareholders in the year 2010. Further, based on the business plans for the year 2011, the group expects to generate sufficient cash flows to meet the obligations as and when they fall due. Accordingly, the financial statements have been prepared assuming that the entity will continue as a going concern.

8. Contingent liabilities

Claims lodged / suits filed against the Company by customers are as given below. The management of the respective Companies and the Company has been legally advised that these cases are not sustainable and accordingly no provisions are considered necessary. The details of the cases, the amount of claim (wherever quantifiable) and the subsidiary of the Company involved is as given below:

- Claim by the insurer on RTS for faulty Title Search causing a loss to the insurer of \$74,000 - probable loss not quantifiable. The Company expects the E&O carrier to cover the damages
- Breach of Contract, negligence and other claims relating to filing of a deed of trust
 in the wrong county and for various contractual obligations amount not
 quantifiable.
- Claim against RTS on allegations of conflicting closing instructions and incomplete refinance package. Damages claimed \$235,717. Causes of action are breach of flduciary duty and professional negligence – amount of probable exposure not quantifiable.
- Failure to close out LOC- US\$ 85,000.
- Mistakenly sued over bankruptcy proceeding- \$US 5,000.
- Failure to timely record a mortgage note on refinance. Amount claimed \$175,000
 which Company intends to defend aggressively amount of exposure not
 quantifiable.
- General case on closing fraud perpetuated suit filed against all entities involved in closing, RTS has no culpability – amount not quantifiable
- Over charging on settlement services allegations of predatory lending practices plaintiff blocked by previous call action - amount of exposure not quantifiable
- Failure to secure release of lien amount not quantifiable
